Minutes of the previous regular meeting of October 1, 2018 were read and approved. Approved claims for payment. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Watne to receive the Sheriff's monthly revenue report and the Auditor's quarterly revenue report. Motion carries. Adam Clemons, Wright County Engineer, presented information concerning Bridge #66 rehabilitation schedule which is on C54, 5 miles south of Clarion. The contractor can move in right now if the County gives the go ahead. The concern is the late fall harvest season. It was agreed by the board to ask Clemons to inform the contractor to wait until harvest is over. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Watne to move into closed session concerning Iowa Code Section 21.5(j) to discuss the purchase of particular real estate within the Secondary Roads department. Motion carries unanimously. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Watne to instruct Adam Clemons to move forward with Plan A as discussed

within the closed session. Motion carries unanimously. Cindy Litwiller, Wright County Economic Development Director, introduced Steve Gilbert with Advanced Homes 360. Mr. Gilbert explained a real estate development project in which they have an interest in the housing needs of Goldfield and working on an agreement to develop land around the old school into affordable single family lots. The agreement would also include remodeling the Goldfield School to make into apartment complex and possibly a daycare. Omar Barrientos with SB & A Architects explained his assessment of the school and develop concepts. ARK Development would be the lead developer on the project. Estimated cost for the project could be 3.5 to 4.5 million dollars. The Board of Supervisors were all in agreement that this is a great use of the existing school and would like this group to continue working with the City of Goldfield. SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE NO. 2018-19

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF EAGLE GROVE, IOWA, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO OPEN BURNING RESTRICTIONS. On October 15, 2018 the City Council of Eagle Grove, Iowa passed the aforementioned ordinance and a summary is as follows: SECTION 1: Section Modified. Section 105.05(4) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Eagle Grove, Iowa, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof: 105.05(4) Landscape Waste. The disposal by open burning of landscape waste originating on the premises. However, the burning of landscape waste produced in clearing, grubbing and construction operations shall be limited to areas located at least one-fourth miles from any building inhabited by other than the landowner or tenant conducting the open burning. Rubber tires shall not be used to ignite landscape waste. Burning of organic yard and garden waste shall be permitted only between dawn and dusk on Saturday and Sunday during the periods April 1 and May 31 and October 1 through November 30 of each year. The City Council may, by resolution, allow burning for specific projects for additional periods of not more than 15 days each. (IAC), 567-23(3d) SECTION 2. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed. SECTION 3: SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional. SECTION 4. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law. Bryce Davis, City Clerk
