Minutes of the previous regular meeting of April 22, 2019 were read and approved. Approved claims for payment. Sandy McGrath, Planning and Zoning Administrator, gave an update on requested and approved building permits. Also gave some background on the Environmental Health programs and what she is doing. McGrath will plan on meeting with the board monthly to give updates on building permits, wells, and septic permits. Courtney Stewart, Drainage Clerk, presented the Joint Drainage District assessments with Webster County. JDD #11-13 is the one joint district to be assessed. Motion by Kluss and seconded by Helgevoid to approve the Joint Drainage District Assessments with Webster County. Motion carries. Motion by Helgevoid and seconded by Kluss to appoint Sheila Cordero as a Civil Process Server. Motion carries. Motion by Kluss and seconded by Helgevoid to approve the Chairman to sign the Certification of Cost Allocation Plan with CASI. Motion carries. Deb Lukes gave some background on DD #125-49-1 of a repair work order that was sent out for tile blowout. Kent Cramer explained that they filled in the entire

meandering waterway to prevent the two areas that crosses the district tile from ever washing out again. He also stated that the landowners did other work to prevent the water from flowing over the district tile. Lee Gallentine with CGA Engineering was previously asked to give an opinion as to the cost of filling in the two areas of exposed tile. His estimate was \$7,400.00. Cramer explained that the cost in Gallentine's estimate was only to fill in the two spots. He went on to say that we would, at the very least, have to replace the dirt over the easement area of fifty foot (50'). Lee Gallentine was then asked if he could refigure his opinion of costs to include covering the fifty foot (50') area Kent Cramer suggested needed to be done. He stated that he could get that information to the trustees by the end of the week. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Helgevoid to direct Lee Gallentine to refigure the calculation of his original opinion of costs to accommodate fifty foot (50') wide coverage over the tile in the two (2) areas, and to hold another meeting after getting the recalculated opinion of costs. Each proposal shall be accompanied by a cashier's check or certified check drawn on a state-chartered or federally chartered bank, or a certified share draft drawn on a state-chartered or federally chartered credit union, or a bidder's bond with corporate surety satisfactory to the County in an amount equal to Ten percent (10%) of the total amount of the proposal. If bid bond is submitted, it must be in the form provided in these specifications. Said check or share draft may be cashed, or the bid bond forfeited as liquidated damages in the event the successful bidder fails or refuses to enter into a contract within ten (10) days of issuance of a Notice of Award and post bond satisfactory to the County insuring the faithful fulfillment of the contract and maintenance of said improvements as required by law. The bid bond should be executed by a corporation authorized to contract as a surety in the State of Iowa, and must not contain any conditions either in the body or as an endorsement thereon. The successful bidder will be required to furnish a corporate surety bond in an amount equal to one hundred per cent (100%) of the contract price, said bond to be issued by a responsible surety approved by the County, and shall guarantee the faithful performance of the contract and the terms and conditions therein contained, the payment for materials used in the project and the maintenance of said improvements in good repair for not less than one (1) year from the time of acceptance of said improvements by the County. The County reserves the right to defer acceptance of any proposal for a period not to exceed sixty (60) calendar days from the date of receipt of bids. The County reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to waive informalities. Payment of the cost of said project will be made from such cash funds of the County as may be legally used for said purpose at the discretion of the County, including but not limited to, the net revenues of the Street Department, the proceeds from the sale of Revenue or General Obligation Bonds, and/or the proceeds from the sale of warrants, as authorized by Section 384.57 of the Code of Iowa, made payable from any or all of the above-mentioned sources. The Contractor will be paid ninety-five per cent (95%) of the Engineer's esti-

mate of the value of acceptable work completed at the end of the preceding month. Final payment will be made not less than thirty-one (31) days after completion of the work and acceptance by the County, subject to the conditions and in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 573 of the Code of Iowa. No such final payment will be due until the Contractor certifies to the County that the materials, labor, and services involved in the final estimate have been paid for in accordance with the requirements stated in the specifications. Wright County is exempt from paying Sales and Use Tax and will supply Contractor with an "Iowa Sales Tax Exemption Certificate" and an authorization letter to allow the Contractor to buy equipment and material for the project tax free. The work on this project shall commence within ten (10) days after receipt by the contractor of a written notice to proceed. All work shall be substantially completed by November 1, 2019, subject to any changes in the contract period as provided for in these specifications. Liquidated damages in the amount of \$250 per calendar day will be assessed for each day that any of the utility work shall remain uncompleted after the end of the contract period, with due allowance for extensions of the contract period due to conditions beyond control of the Contractor. By virtue of statutory authority, a preference will be given to products and provisions grown and coal produced within the State of Iowa. To the extent required by Iowa statutes, a resident bidder shall be allowed a preference as against a nonresident bidder from a state or foreign country if that state or foreign country gives or requires any preference to bidders from that state or foreign country, including but not limited to any preference to bidders, the imposition of any type of labor force preference, or any other form of preferential treatment to bidders or laborers from that state or foreign country. The preference allowed shall be equal to the preference given or required by the state or foreign country in which the nonresident bidder is a resident. In the instance of a resident labor force preference, a nonresident bidder shall apply the same resident labor force preference to a public improvement in this state as would be required in

the construction of a public improvement by the state or foreign country in which the nonresident bidder is a resident.
